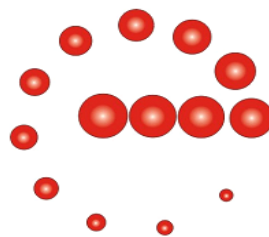

Opinions on electricity Network Code and Guideline Regulations	<i>Coordinated by the ECRB President<sup>e</sup></i>	The principles of the Energy Community law, and in particular Article 89 of the Energy Community Treaty, require network codes and guidelines adopted and/or amended in the EU under Regulation 714/2009 or Regulation 715/2009 and incorporated into the Energy Community <i>acquis communautaire</i> based on Decision 2011/O2/MC-EnC to be transposed into the national legal systems of the Contracting Parties. Article 3(3) of PHLG Procedural Act 01/2012 on adoption of Network Codes and Guidelines requests the Secretariat to seek for the Opinion of ECRB on the Proposals before PHLG adoption. The ECRB electricity working group is in charge of coordinated review of electricity related documents.	<b>ECRB Opinion</b>	Upon receipt by the Secretariat
VI. Implementation of Network Codes and Guideline Regulations	<i>Coordinated by ECRB Section</i>	Monitoring the status of implementation of Network Codes and Guideline Regulations in line with requirements from Network Codes requires assessment and exchanges with National Regulatory Authority. Under this task, EWG will review ACER's and ENTSO-E monitoring process and report on monitoring activity.
